cognitive-behavioural treatments are more effective than other forms of treatment (eg, psychodynamic, client-centred) But, a cognitive-behavioural treatment program, in and of itself, may not reduce offender recidivism If the program fails to target criminogenic needs (Need Principle) and with the appropriate
