Infantry during the English Civil War were usually organized in mixed units of pikemen and musketeers, the ideal ratio of pike to musket was thought to be 1:2, but units with a 1:1 ratio were common, particularly early in the war and when muskets were in short supply

### **The Political Consequences of Civil Wars**
