How to Be Reasonably Sure a Client is Not Pregnant

because women who are currently pregnant do not require contraception In addition, methods such as IUDs should never be initiated in pregnant women because doing so might lead to septic miscarriage, a serious complication Providers often rely on the presence of menses as an indicator that a woman is not pregnant However, providers

How to be Reasonably Sure a Client is Not Pregnant

Client is Not Pregnant Ask the client questions 1-6 As soon as the client answers YES to any question, stop, and follow the instructions NO 1 Did your last menstrual period start within the past 7 days?* YES NO 2 Have you abstained from sexual intercourse since your last

Checklist for Screening Clients Who Want to Initiate ...

is not pregnant If a client answers "yes" to any of these questions, and there are no signs or symptoms of pregnancy, it is highly likely that she is not

pregnant The client can start COCs now If the client is within 5 days of the start of her menstrual bleeding, she can start the method immediately No back-up method is needed

Women who are pregnant can become infected with the same STDs as women who are not pregnant Pregnancy does not provide women or their babies any additional protection against STDs Many STDs are 'silent,' or have no symptoms, so you may not know if you are infected If you are pregnant, you should be tested for STDs, including HIV (the

Reproductive Management of the Mare

A mare may be pregnant if she exhibits no signs of heat 18 to 20 days after her last ovulation However, some mares may not cycle because of follicular or corpora luteal abnormalities, or they may have silent heat periods in which external signs of estrus are not evident These problem mares would not be bred again if absence of heat was the only

Valley Fever and Pregnant Women - CDPH Home

Pregnant women, especially during the third trimester of pregnancy and immediately after giving birth, are at a higher risk for getting severe Valley Fever than women who are not pregnant In severe cases, patients may need to be hospitalized and, in rare cases, the infection can spread beyond the lungs to other organs (this is called disseminated
