To subdue a Boer population of about 200,000 including a Boer army of some 65,000 took two and a half years and required some 450,000 British troops including reservists and domestic and colonial volunteers Some 100-120,000 black and coloured Africans were drawn into the British war effort, perhaps as many as 40,000 of them under arms
