Between 1347 and 1352, the Black Death killed more than 20 million people in Europe This was one-third or more of Europe’s population<sup>1</sup> The plague began in Asia and spread to Europe on trading ships At the time, no one knew what caused the plague Many years later, the source was found to be bacteria from black rats and fleas

**The Columbian Exchange**

Virgin-soil epidemics are among the deadliest phenomena ever experienced by humankind, and the death toll of the pandemics unleashed in the Americas by the Columbian Exchange far exceeded that of history's most famous virgin-soil epidemic, Europe's Black Death (an outbreak of bubonic plague in the 1340s) The cataclysmic effects of
